**MOTION FOR THIRD EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH

I.

The Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter are due to be served and filed on April 4, 2016.

II.

Pursuant to RE: Extension Requests in Criminal Direct Appeals and Post-Conviction Relief Certiorari Proceedings: Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009, the State moves for a **third** extension in the above-referenced criminal appeal and asks for an additional thirty days to complete the brief in this case. In the past few weeks, the undersigned has participated in oral argument at the Court of Appeals in State v. Ernest Maurice

Allen and State v. Shawndell Q. McClenton; has submitted a Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the Supreme Court in State v. Thompson and State v. Ellison, State v. Furquan, and State v. Dudley.
