



regard, let them be such as will pass readily in South Carolina.

The certificates will be signed and numbered, and let the agent or minister whose business it is to deal them out, number each Sub-Certificate with the same number found on the main certificate. On the \$100 Scholarship let 25 sub-certificates be numbered and the balance cut off and burnt, not thrown away, so on the \$60 and \$40 Scholarship, let the requisite number of sub-certificates be numbered and the balance burnt.

N. B. We would also advise the agent or minister who deals out the certificates to sign his name to each sub-certificate. This will be a small labor among so many, but rather numerous for one man.

By mail — the name of the individual to whom a certificate is given and the number of his certificate, (be particular) also whether it is settled for by cash or note, and send up as soon as possible a particular account of these things to the undersigned, so that the name, number, Post Office, and indebtedness of every subscriber to the endowment may be entered in a book, and thus the exact condition of the College may be known to all concerned in its welfare, and also the Plan of Endowment be strictly and faithfully carried out.
