MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME



Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Mickey Lane Mayberry v. The State of South Carolina on March 18, 2016 with this Court. Counsel filed a petition for rehearing in the case of Willis Weary v. The State of South Carolina on March 15, 2016 with the Court of Appeals. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Michael Gentile on March 9, 2016 with the Court of Appeals. Counsel filed a petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. Sammy Lee Scarborough on March 4, 2016 with the Court of Appeals. Counsel filed a petition for rehearing on the case of Stephen Smalls v. The State on February 22, 2016, with the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.






