ORDER

Appellant has filed a motion for a second extension of time to file her initial brief. Appellant has also filed an initial brief and designation of matter. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss, arguing Appellant has not timely prosecuted her appeal. Specifically, Respondent argues (1) Appellant did not timely obtain the transcript, (2) Appellant did not timely file her initial brief and designation of matter, and (3) Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter do not comply with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.

After consideration, Respondent's motion to dismiss is denied. However, Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter are stricken. Within thirty days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file an amended initial brief and an amended designation of matter that complies with the appellate court rules. *See* Rule 208(b), SCACR (setting forth the contents of the initial brief and requiring it to "contain references to the transcript, pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials which may be properly included in the Record on Appeal . . . to support the salient facts alleged"); Rule 209(b), SCACR (setting forth the contents of the designation of matter). A sample appellant's brief is included in Appendix C, Form 13, of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. A sample designation of matter is included in Appendix C, Form 14, of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. Failure to comply with this order may result in the dismissal of this appeal.
