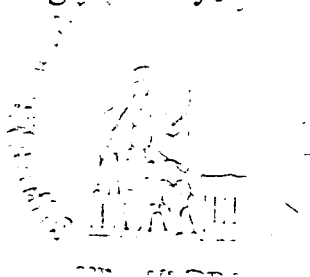

ORDER

By order dated April 15, 2016, the petition for a writ of certiorari filed in this matter was denied based on the vote of the full Court. On May 3, 2016, no petition for rehearing having been received, the remittitur was sent to the lower court, ending appellate jurisdiction in the matter. Rule 221, SCACR. On May 6, 2016, this Court received a petition for rehearing. Because the petition was received more than fifteen days after the filing of the order denying the petition for a writ of certiorari, it was untimely, and the remittitur was properly sent. *Id.*; *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). Therefore, the petition for rehearing is hereby dismissed.
