

MOTION TO EXCEED PAGE LIMITATIONS

THIS MATTER comes before the Court by way of an appeal from the South Carolina Court of Appeals. Pursuant to Rule 242(d)(4), SCACR, a petition for a writ of certiorari is not to exceed twenty-five pages. The Petitioner respectfully moves this Honorable Court to permit him to exceed the page limitation set forth in Rule 242(d)(4) in this matter. This case involves five separate grounds for relief and was the subject of two Court of Appeals opinions. See State v. Taylor 396 S.C. 193, 720 S.E.2d 522 (Ct. App. 2011); State v. Taylor, ___ S.C. ___, 731 S.E.2d 596 (Ct. App. 2012). Due to the complexity of the issues involved and the numerous rulings made by the Court of Appeals which the Petitioner contends were erroneous, the Petitioner could

not adequately address the merits of this case within the page limitations set forth in Rule 242(d)(4). Accordingly, the Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court relax these page limitations and permit him to file his petition for a writ of certiorari, which consists of thirty-three pages, not including the cover page or index.


