PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE RETURN TO PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Counsel for Andre Jackson, petitions the Court for a thirty day extension in which to file the return to the petition for writ of certiorari in this case. In support of this petition, counsel shows:

1. The return to the petition for writ of certiorari in this case is due to be filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Mr. Jackson respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.
3. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in Michael Witcher v. State on January 20, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. David Chavez on January 20, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Lorenzo Inman and the return to petition for writ of certiorari for Shanna Kranchick v. State on January 17, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Craig Keeling on January 9, 2012. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in Lorenzo R. Nicholson v. State on January 5, 2011. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in State v. Tawanda

Williams on December 22, 2011. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Jeffrey Herrmann was filed on December 21, 2011.

4. Counsel has not had time to complete the return to petition for writ of certiorari in this case. As a result, counsel respectfully asks this Court for a thirty day extension, in which to file the return to petition for writ of certiorari. Counsel is striving to limit the number of extensions requested. Counsel is attempting to complete the cases with the most number of extensions first.

5. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purposes of delay.

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case based upon the above circumstances.



(3) Counsel failed to file the petition for an extension in which to file the return to petition for writ of certiorari in a timely manner.


(4) As indicated by his signature below, Harold Coombs, Jr. of the Attorney General's Office does not oppose this request






