MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Tristian Cheek respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

2. Counsel for Mr. Cheek respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. 


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.




