I, the Plaintiff in Appellate Case No. 2015-002593 am seeking a re-hearing in the dismissal of my case that was ruled on by one judge as I am to believe. I request a rehearing before the full panel of judges. The denial of my request to proceed in appalette court in forma pauperis is said to be denied on the basis of Ex Parte Martin 321, S. C. 533. \$71 S.E.2d 134 (1995), it list a few instances where indigent status could be granted. It goes on to say the the 3-4 ones listed are not excusive. I am to assume I do not have to be in family court or in prison to be granted inform pauperis. I sent the appellate court paper work showing that I was granted informa pauperis status in the court of common pleas. It stretches credulity to believe that if I the Plaintiff have issues in the lower court as and indigent that somehow in appellate court plaintiff can become un-indigent. I have a constructional right to due process as an indigent and to be appointed an attorney on this basis if I can't afford one or am not up to speed as a Pro Se litigant. Welfare, family court and prisoners are all impacted by the state or the federal government in cases that go before the court. It means that a citizen is being impacted by the state or the state or federal government is impacting the citizen. The Laurens county sheriffs department impacted me, they cuffed and detained me and I was not involved in the case at hand, not even remotely. When they cuffed and placed me in a squad car they knew that their suspects and victim were all caucasian. There is an important liberty granted to all citizens beyond assistance of counsel to due process and fundamental fairness. This liberty extends the physical liberty, due process and fundamental fairness. I sent the appeals court the paper work granting me in leave to proceed in foma pauperis in the lower court. It seemed to be accepted and for months I did not hear from the court. Then I heard from the court indicating to me that the appeals court wanted me to ask them for leave to proceed in forma pauperis, I sent the one page form since they already had the paper work with all of my financial information granting leave in the lower court. The dismissal of my case at least shows some bias or misconduct by the court in my case. Rule 3 (b) 1 indicates, and I sent this form to the court, that fees could be waived if they

were waived in the circuit court. It was ignored. I pray that the court re-hears and reverses the dismissal or search the list of "exhaustive qualifications" as so I can have constitutional due process in this case. There were issues with the plaintiffs lawyer being late with the answer to this plaintiffs filing and the dismissal based on statute of limitations when it was clear by my statement in the filing on appeal that rule / section 15-3-40 allowed plaintiff 3 years to file a civil case, either the codes or rules mean something or they don't. I pray that they full panel finds my statement to be correct and appropriate basis for a reversal of the dismissal of my case.

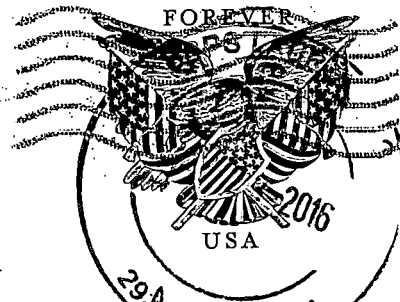
