
Dear Ms. Kitchings:

I am a bit confused over the attached letter dated May 17, 2016, regarding the "due" date of respondent's initial brief and designation of matter being due on April 25, 2016.

On February 16, 2016, I had a conversation with Shelby in the clerk's office where she stated that the original "due" date was actually February 18, 2016. Given that the Appellant's briefs were accepted and "loaded" on December 8, 2016, I move to suggest that the Appeal should be heard without the respondent's briefs as a part of the case. In past arguments, the plaintiff has urged the court to act upon motions and hearings due to the lack of timeliness of the defendant's, Richard Campanaro, responses. While, it has been documented that all defendant / appellant correspondence have, indeed, been within the stated time-line per the court, it is glaring that the defendant's argument of timeliness should work against their case; as they have failed to provide requested briefs for over 6 months.

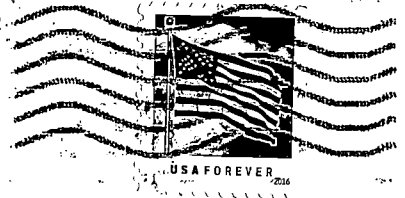
