ORDER DENYING APPELLANT'S
MOTION FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME

This matter is before the South Carolina Administrative Law Court ("the ALC" or "the Court") pursuant to the appeal of Akeem Abdullah-Malik ("Appellant"), an inmate incarcerated with the South Carolina Department of Corrections. Appellant challenges the final decision of the South Carolina Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services' ("Department's") Board which found that Appellant should not be released on parole.


This case was assigned to the undersigned on January 12, 2016. The Department filed the Record on Appeal on March 10, 2016. On March 16, 2016, Appellant filed his Brief of Appellant, which included several lengthy attachments. Subsequently, the Department requested an extension of time in which to file its brief. The Court granted the Department's request on April 28, 2016. On May 20, 2016, the Department filed the Brief of Respondent. Thereafter, on June 1, 2016, Appellant filed a motion seeking an extension of time in which to reply to the Brief of Respondent. Respondent was non-specific on the amount of time he is requesting, but simply stated that his unit is on lock-down.

Having thoroughly reviewed the documents filed by the parties, the Court finds that the Brief of Appellant adequately addresses the issues on appeal, and there is nothing Appellant could provide in addition which could further assist the Court's review of this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Appellant's Motion for Enlargement of Time is **DENIED**.
