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STATEMENT OF ISSUES ON APPEAL

The denial of Unemployment Benefits by the South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce made its decision which was appealed on November 16, 2015. On March 3, 2016, an Order Granting Motion To Dismiss was filed by the Administrative Law Judge. This decision was pursuant to ALC Rule 38, Failure to comply with the rules of procedures for appeals.

FACTS

The loss of unemployment benefits has and continues to cause great hardship on the family. Guanna McCormick has struggled for months now due to the denial of benefits. It will continue to be a hardship unless unemployment benefits are paid. At this point Guanna McCormick does not have the finances to seek out employment because the expenses (car, gas, insurance, etc.) of looking for work cannot be covered. If the unemployment benefits were paid she could seek gainful employment.
