

MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The Appellants, alleging good cause, hereby move for an extension of time of thirty (30) days for the filing and service of their Initial Brief and Designation of Matter. The Appellants actually received notice of the entry of the July 26, 2012 Order under appeal on Monday, July 30, 2012, the Appellants filed a Notice of Appeal on August 24, 2012, and by letter filed September 20, 2012 have sought a single earlier extension. If the requested relief is granted, the Initial Brief and Designation will fall due on or before Tuesday, November 27, 2012.

The grounds for such Motion are as follows: 1) This appeal is currently less than sixty (60) days old; 2) The granting of the relief requested will not substantially delay the processing of this appeal; 3) The undersigned has multiple Common Pleas, Administrative Law Court, and Federal Court hearings, duties and deadlines upcoming in the next week to fifteen (15) days and, also due to the general workload of the undersigned sole practitioner, the attorney finds it impossible to properly fulfill his duties to the Appellants, the Respondent, and this Court; 4) The requested extension appears to afford sufficient "no court" time in the state Circuits and other forums in which the undersigned currently has matters pending for the proper completion of this Court's requirements.




