I, Mamie Jackson, would request the Court to reinstate the appeal for the following reasons:





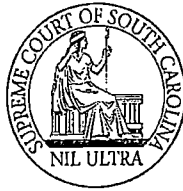

On the date you hand-delivered the letter, I contacted the court reporter and asked her to respond to your letter.
