ORDER

Appellants have served and filed a notice of appeal from an order of the circuit court, which reverses a decision of the Appellate Panel of the South Carolina Workers' Compensation Commission and remands the case to the Commission. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss, contending this appeal is not immediately appealable. After careful consideration of the parties' filings, the motion to dismiss is granted because the underlying order on appeal is not an immediately appealable order. *See Bone v. U.S. Food Serv.*, 404 S.C. 67, 84, 744 S.E.2d 552, 562 (2013) ("[An] order remanding the matter to the Commission for further proceedings does not constitute a final judgment as required by section 1-23-390 [of the South Carolina Code] and, therefore, is not immediately appealable."). The remittitur will be sent as required by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
