ORDER

Appellant is attempting to appeal from a habeas corpus proceeding in which the lower court determined that habeas corpus relief was improper because the issues could have been raised in a timely application under the Post-Conviction Relief Act. Pursuant to Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(vi), SCACR, Appellant is required to provide a written explanation to this Court as to why the lower court's determination was improper. Appellant has filed an explanation, but the explanation does not "contain sufficient facts, argument and citation to legal authority to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper." Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(vi), SCACR. Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed.
