## ORDER

The appellant filed a pro se notice of appeal dated February 2, 2016. No proof of service was provided. Two deficiency letters were sent to trial counsel in an effort to obtain a proof of service and a guilty plea explanation pursuant to Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). On June 6, 2016, counsel provided a "notice of intent to appeal" stating sentence was imposed on January 21, 2016, and there was no issue he could identify under Rule 203, SCACR. The proof of service upon the Deputy Solicitor stated a hand delivery date of May 31, 2016. Under the proof of service provided by counsel, the appeal is untimely under Rule 203(b)(2), SCACR (notice of appeal shall be served within ten days after the sentence is imposed). The appeal is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
