APPELLANT'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Pursuant to Rule 240 and 263(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, the Appellant, Kim Murphy ("Appellant"), by and through her undersigned counsel hereby requests an order granting Appellant a 30-day extension of time to file and serve the Initial Brief and Designation of Matter. This request is being made because: (1) both attorneys who were working on Appellant's case are no longer associated with the law firm representing Appellant, and (2) the law firm representing Appellant has at least four or five upcoming trials for which the firm must prepare between now and the end of the year.

Due to the attorneys' departure from the law firm, the senior attorney of the firm, an active member of the bar since 1959, has had to reassign Appellant's case to his associates and allow them sufficient time to review and work on Appellant's case. Although the senior attorney


is, as far as he knows, still mentally and physically able to work on and prepare cases, he needs assistance from his associates because of the caseload of the firm and other obligations.

Furthermore, this is a complex case and may be a case of first impression as to whether an elected public official like Appellant can be arbitrarily removed in the middle of her term if the removal is not based on misconduct or job performance. A 30-day extension would allow Appellant's attorneys to have sufficient time to review Appellant's complex case and draft Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter.

Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter are currently due September 14, 2016. If the request is granted, Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter will be due October 14, 2016.

Opposing counsel is aware of Appellant's Motion for Extension of Time and has consented to the same.


