

Discrimination Complaint

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On Thursday, August 11, 2016; at approximately 11 am I inquired of the Receptionist desk to see if the Deputy Clerk of Court was available. I was told that she was just getting out of a meeting and would be with me.

I told the Receptionist that I was going to the bathroom and would be back in a few minutes. When I returned I asked for the case file of the case I was there for in order to expedite time.

After having waited for minutes, I asked of the Deputy Clerk. I learned that the Receptionist had not even contacted the Deputy Clerk. I was questioning her as to why she would do that. Why would she tell me that she would be with me and why after I asked for the Deputy Clerk why she had not been contacted. She wanted to know if I wanted to speak to the case owner.

Another White female clerk then interrupted and told me I was being rude. My response to her is my response to the Court why do White female personnel

think they have the right to categorize my questioning them of unprofessional behavior is. Dude. I have not said anything in a rude manner or voiced anything in rude language. Clearly this 2nd white female clerk thought that she had the right to chastise. Why? Isn't this a racial issue. That because I am Black, I do not have the right in the minds of these two white females to conduct business in a professional manner and to be treated professionally.

Why would a clerk think that she should decide for me who I should see? And why would she pretend that that person would be with me momentarily and have me to wait?
