**SECOND MOTION BY THE SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS  
TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE BY WHICH IT MAY FILE ITS  
PETITION FOR REHEARING**

On August 3, 2016, the Court of Appeals issued its opinion in the above-captioned matter. *See Joshua Cramer, Appellant, v. S.C. Dep't of Corr., Respondent*, Unpublished Opinion No. 2016-UP-392 (Aug. 3, 2016). 2016 WL 4125880 (S.C. Ct. App. 2016).

On August 17, 2016, the Respondent, the South Carolina Department of Corrections ["SCDC"], by and through its undersigned counsel, moved the Court for 10-day extension of the deadline associated with filing its petition for rehearing in the instant case. Specifically, SCDC sought an extension of the aforementioned deadline from August 18, 2016 to August 29, 2016. By an order issued August 22, 2016, the Court granted SCDC's motion.

SCDC's undersigned counsel now respectfully moves a second time to extend the deadline by which he may file and serve SCDC's petition for rehearing. Specifically, SCDC's


undersigned counsel seeks a new deadline of Tuesday, September 6, 2016 by which to file and serve SCDC's petition for rehearing.

SCDC's undersigned counsel files the instant motion in light of obligations he has very recently confronted in another matter, namely conducting several day-long depositions, in *Oliver v. University of South Carolina, et al.*, 2015-CP-40-3502. SCDC's undersigned counsel also moves in light of recent obligations he confronted in representing a client under investigation by state law enforcement authorities, as well as a matter in which he has very recently provided counseling to a corporate client involved in a dispute impacting its day-to-day operations.

SCDC's undersigned counsel anticipates that he will file and serve SCDC's petition for rehearing in the instant matter no later than Wednesday, August 31, 2016. However, SCDC's undersigned counsel seeks an extension until Tuesday, September 6, 2016 out of an abundance of caution.

For these reasons, SCDC's undersigned counsel respectfully urges this Court to grant his instant motion, and, accordingly, SCDC's undersigned counsel respectfully urges this Court to extend the deadline by which SCDC may file and serve its petition for rehearing until Tuesday, September 6, 2016.


