APPELLANT'S OBJECTION TO  
RESPONDENT'S REQUEST FOR  
EXTENSION OF TIME

The Appellant, Terry Douglas Campbell, hereby objects to the Respondent's letter to the Clerk of Court dated August 30, 2016, asking for an extension of time to file their Initial Brief and Designation of Matter as the counsel for the Respondents neglected to order a copy of the motion hearing transcript which they state they need to prepare their Initial Brief until August 30, 2016, which was over eight months after receiving the Notice of Appeal, but rather waited on delivery of the transcript to the Appellant before requesting a copy.

The counsel for the Respondents should be familiar with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules and should have known that after being served a Notice of Appeal its only a matter of time before Briefs are filed and if they were to need a copy of the transcript that it should be ordered and also familiar with the time limits prescribed in Rule 208(a)(2), SCACR.

Instead of ordering a copy of the transcript after being served the Notice of Appeal, the Respondents wait until the

Appellant serves them with a copy of his Initial Brief which included the letter from the Court Reporter regarding delivery of the transcript to the Appellant and then waits an additional nineteen days before sending the Clerk of Court a letter on the counsel for the Respondent's, Davidson + Lindemann, P.A. letter head, requesting an extension of time to file their Initial Brief and Designation of Matter.

The South Carolina Appellate Court Rules do allow for Extending and Diminishing Time Prescribed by these Rules Pursuant to Rule 234(b) SCACR, but must be in the form of either a motion or petition Pursuant to Rule 224, SCACR, and must comply with the requirements of Rule 238, SCACR. The letter which the Respondents sent to the Clerk of Court fails to comply with any of these rules and is not the proper procedure to request an extension of time.

Due to the facts that the Respondents have had ample time, over six months, to obtain a copy of the transcript and that they failed to request an extension in the manner prescribed by the SCACR, I hereby request that their letter to the Clerk requesting extension of time be considered moot and their request denied

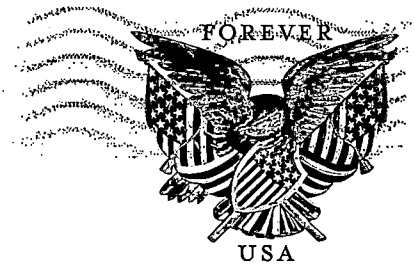
