- X Category II Unfounded Report - The evidence produced by the investigation was inconclusive as to whether abuse or neglect occurred.
- Category III Unfounded Report - An investigation could not be completed because the department was unable to locate the child or family or for some other compelling reason.

If classified as Category I or II, this means that the investigation has been concluded. Category III cases may be reopened if additional information is received which allows the Department to complete the investigation. Also, as provided by state law, identifying information regarding you and/or the children has been eliminated from the Department's Central Registry of Child Abuse and Neglect. The agency's investigative file will be destroyed no later than one year from the date of the case decision and information will be kept confidential pursuant to S.C. Code Section 20-7-650(I). During one year, the report and related information found in a Category II or III Unfounded Report may be used by the Department or law enforcement agencies in relation to child abuse and neglect investigations or proceedings involving the subject or the same child.

If you have reason to believe that the report was made maliciously or in bad faith, pursuant to Section 20-7-695, you have the right to request in writing that the record be retained by the department for up to two years from the date of the case decision. This written request must be received by the department within thirty days of receipt of the case decision. Should you choose to exercise this right, you have the right to request a copy of the record.

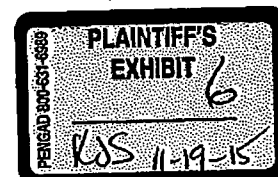

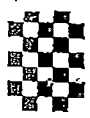

I, victim am about to make known to Investigator George Smith, GCSO, that I volunteer the following information of my own free will, for whatever purposes it may serve.

Some time between February and April, LL3 Youth Groups went on a camping trip to Andrews S.C. It was very cold outside and it rained a little bit. My friend Charles Harrison asked me if I wanted to go. We went back in the woods about 9 miles and a half there were corn fields all around with two houses on either side of the street. We set up camp around like 7:30 PM. We made a bon fire and then went to bed around 11:00 About 2 to 3 hours later Troy woke me up by putting his hand over my mouth and telling me to be quiet. He took me to a separate tent and started touching my penis. He was honestly rubbing and fondling it. He did this for like 30 minutes continuously touching me. I told him to stop numerous times he just told me to be quiet. After that he took me back to the other tent and made me sleep beside him. I guess so I wouldn't say nothing. I'm not really sure if anyone saw anything but if they did Zack Webster or Charles Harrison would be the ones that saw.

Dear Mr. Taylor:

I am in receipt of your recent correspondence dated September 9, and September 16, 2009. In these letters (as well as your father's letter to me), you talk about the Supreme Court's recent decision in State v. Edwards, which was decided on August 31, 2009. While I will certainly be utilizing the decision, as it is the most recent Supreme Court decision dealing with Batson issues, it is not directly on point with your case. I know you have been doing some reading on the issue, but, for your edification, Batson is a three-step procedure. First, one side alleges that the other side struck jurors on the basis of race or gender (primarily). Second, the burden shifts to the party which struck the jurors to provide a race-neutral explanation for their strikes. Once the race-neutral reason is provided, the burden shifts to the moving party to show why those facially race-neutral reasons are pretextual (in other words, that the attorney is just trying to come up with some reason to hide the fact that he actually struck the juror on the basis of race).


In Edwards, the Supreme Court was dealing with explanations that were race-neutral that the trial court found to be not race-neutral. Without getting too technical, the trial court's ruling violated the *second* step of the Batson procedure—whether the explanation given was or was not race-neutral. While that may be an issue in your case—whether *all* of the explanations that were given were race-neutral—the trial court in your case found, based on the State's argument, that some of the explanations given were race-neutral and some were not. This is a problem with the *third* step of the Batson procedure—whether the trial court improperly found that the reason given was pretextual. Winning on an improper decision regarding the second step is far easier than winning on an improper decision regarding the third step.

Finally, with regard to your final line in your letter dated September 16, you state that you'd like to read my arguments before they are filed. I am afraid that I will not be able to comply with this request. I usually make the final revisions on my client's briefs within a couple of days prior to the day that the brief needs to be filed, and I frequently am revising all the way up to the day that the brief is to be filed. Of course, I will send you a copy of my brief when I file it with the Court of Appeals.

On September 27, 2007, this court convened for a hearing of the defendant's post trial motions, which were filed after a Williamsburg County jury found the defendant guilty of kidnapping and criminal sexual conduct with a minor, first degree. Both offenses are "most serious" under S.C. Code Section 17-25-45. Prior to trial, the State had duly served the defendant and defense counsel with notice that it would seek a sentence of life in prison, without possibility of parole. The basis for this notice was that the defendant had previously entered a guilty plea in Georgetown County to a charge of criminal sexual conduct with a minor, first degree, obviously also a "most serious" offense. Consequently, the defendant has arguably sustained the second of his "two strikes" and is subject to mandatory life without parole.

At the September 27 hearing, the defendant advanced five basic arguments:

1. Concurrent life sentences should have been imposed for the kidnapping and CSC convictions (this court imposed consecutive life sentences).
2. The court should have entered a directed verdict of acquittal on the basis that the State did not establish that venue was proper in Williamsburg County.

3. The life without parole (LWOP) notice should have been quashed in that the Williamsburg County incident and the Georgetown County incident should be construed to be one continuous event and not subject to separate consideration insofar as imposition of a life sentence for two most serious convictions is concerned.
4. An imposition of life without parole under Section 17-25-45 was not otherwise warranted in light of recent case law interpreting that code section.
5. This court erred in refusing to give an "advance ruling" to the defendant as to whether the court would allow evidence (for impeachment purposes) of the defendant's convictions in Georgetown County for CSC first with a minor and two counts of lewd act on a minor.

1. CONSECUTIVE SENTENCES

The defendant cites no authority for the proposition that imposition of consecutive life sentences amounts to cruel and unusual punishment. In my view, the facts of this case are such that consecutive sentences are appropriate.

2. VENUE

A criminal defendant is entitled "to a directed verdict when the State fails to present evidence that the offense was committed in the county alleged in the indictment." State v Evans, 307 S.C. 477, 480, 415 S.E. 2nd 816, 818 (1992), overruled in part on other grounds by State v Gentry, 363 S.C. 93, 610 S.E. 2nd 494 (2005). However, as noted in State v Crocker, 366 S.C. 394, 621 S.E. 2nd 890, 895 (Ct. App. 2005), "[t]he standard for establishing venue is not a stringent one, for 'venue, like jurisdiction, in a criminal case

need not be affirmatively proved, and circumstantial evidence of venue, though slight, is sufficient.” (quoting State v Williams, 321 S.C. 327, 334, 468 S.E. 2nd 626, 630 (1996).

The defendant maintains there was insufficient evidence as a matter of law that the incident occurred in Williamsburg County. The court, upon joint request of the parties, submitted the question of venue to the jury, charging that the place of the crime had to be established by the greater weight of the evidence. The submission of this issue to the jury was error, but in and of itself is not the error claimed by the defendant. In my view, the evidence taken as a whole establishes, however slightly, that the offense occurred in Williamsburg County.


3. MOTION TO QUASH LWOP NOTICE

The evidence established that the instant crimes occurred in November 1998 in Williamsburg County. The evidence also established that the defendant engaged in basically identical criminal conduct with the very same victim in August 1999 in Georgetown County. Several months before the Williamsburg County trial, the defendant entered a plea of guilty to CSC first with a minor (the 1999 offense) before the Honorable Edward C. Cottingham in Georgetown County and received a sentence of eight (8) years. The defendant now claims that pursuant to S.C. Code Section 17-25-50, the Williamsburg County conviction and the Georgetown County conviction should be treated as one offense for sentencing purposes. Obviously, CSC first with a minor and kidnapping are both “most serious” offenses under Section 17-25-45 (these two Williamsburg County convictions are one strike) and if the defendant’s contention is correct, he would not be subject to life imprisonment pursuant to 17-25-45. The defendant urges this result on the basis that the Williamsburg and Georgetown crimes

involved the same victim and on the basis that the Georgetown County incident was admitted into evidence under State v Lyle, 125 S.C. 406, 118 S.E. 803 (1923) as part of a common scheme or plan. I disagree. The defendant's actions did involve a common scheme or plan under State v Lyle; however, there is no authority for the proposition that separate offenses which amount to a "common scheme or plan" under Lyle are necessarily "so closely connected in point of time that they may be considered as one offense" under Section 17-25-50. There may be some factual scenarios in which the conclusion argued by the defendant is correct, but under the circumstances of this case, the existence of a common scheme or plan under Lyle does not warrant a finding that the Williamsburg and Georgetown crimes were part of one continuous course of conduct under Section 17-25-50. Therefore, the LWOP notice should not be quashed on this basis.

4. IS DEFENDANT OTHERWISE SUBJECT TO LWOP?

The defendant contends that the Supreme Court of South Carolina's holding in State v Gordon, 356 S.C. 143, 588 S.E. 2nd 105 (2003) forecloses a sentence of life without parole. Again, this defendant has two convictions for criminal sexual conduct in the first degree with a minor. The first offense occurred in November 1998 in Williamsburg County, which of course is the subject of the instant conviction. The second offense occurred in 1999 in Georgetown County. The victim in both cases was the same eleven (11) year old boy. In 2006, the defendant pled guilty to the 1999 Georgetown County offense. The State contends this was "strike one". The defendant was then served with an LWOP notice for the Williamsburg County case, and the jury



trial resulted in a conviction for CSC first with a minor (and kidnapping). The State contends this conviction was strike two and compels an LWOP sentence.

The following discussion includes the relevant legislative history of Section 17-25-45, appellate cases interpreting this statute (and Section 17-25-50), and the arguments presented by the State and the defendant.

A. Legislative History of § 17-25-45

The earliest version of South Carolina Code § 17-25-45 was enacted in 1982 and provided that a third conviction for certain listed crimes would result in a life sentence. The 1982 version specifically provided that "a conviction shall be considered a second conviction only if the date of the commission of the second crime occurred subsequent to the imposition of the sentence of the first offense." 1982 S.C. Acts No. 358 § 1, pp. 2175-76. A similar provision defined a "third conviction." In 1986, the General Assembly amended § 17-25-45 to provide that a third conviction for a crime defined as "violent" in South Carolina Code § 16-1-60 would result in a life sentence. This amendment specifically included the same definitions of a "second conviction" and "third conviction" set forth in the 1982 version discussed above. 1986 S.C. Acts No. 462 § 37, p. 2996. In 1995, the General Assembly amended § 17-25-45 to provide that either a second conviction for a "most serious" crime or a third conviction for a "serious" crime would lead to a sentence of life. The 1995 amendment deleted the specific definitions for second and third convictions, and substituted the language of "prior conviction" now found in section (F) of the statute. 1995 S.C. Acts No. 83 § 18, pp. 565-68.

Up until the passage of the 1995 version, § 17-25-45 specifically required that a second or subsequent offense be committed after imposition of a sentence on the first or

previous offense. Currently, the statute only requires there to be a prior conviction. The logical conclusion as to the 1995 amendment is that the General Assembly intended to eliminate the requirement that the offenses be committed in sequence.

A plain reading of § 17-25-45(F) as it was written at the time of this offense subjects Taylor to life without parole. The statute states “[f]or the purpose of determining a prior or previous conviction under this section and Section 17-25-50, a prior or previous conviction shall mean the defendant has been convicted of a most serious or serious offense, as may be applicable, on a separate occasion, prior to the instant adjudication.” (emphasis added). The words “prior conviction” mean only that § 17-25-45 is premised upon a conviction-to-conviction sequence rather than a conviction-to-offense sequence or an offense-to-offense sequence. In other words, the statute does not require that the previous conviction upon which an enhanced sentence is based precede the commission of the offense upon which the sentence is being imposed. Under this interpretation of the statute, § 17-25-45 applies even when the defendant has first been convicted of one offense that actually occurred after another separate offense.

In the present case, Taylor had a prior conviction for the 1999 offense. Although the 1999 offense occurred after the 1998 Williamsburg County offense, he still had a prior conviction “prior to the instant adjudication.” According to the statute, Taylor is subject to life without parole because he had that prior conviction.

B. South Carolina Cases Interpreting § 17-25-45

The Supreme Court first interpreted the 1995 version of § 17-25-45, and specifically the language in subsection (F) concerning “prior convictions,” in State v. Benjamin, 353 S.C. 441, 579 S.E.2d 289 (2003). In Benjamin, the Court held that the

recidivist statute must be construed independently of any other statute, specifically finding § 17-25-50 to be inapplicable in a "three strikes rule" analysis. However, nine months later Benjamin was overruled by State v. Gordon, 356 S.C. 143, 588 S.E.2d 105 (2003). In Gordon, the Court found that its holding in Benjamin regarding the independent nature of § 17-25-45 was contrary to legislative intent and prior precedent of the Court.

In Gordon, the Court states that "the recidivist statute is aimed at career criminals, those who have been previously sentenced and commit another crime, not at those whose recidivist status is premised solely upon acts which occur at times so closely connected in point of time that they may be considered one offense." *Id.* at 111, 588 S.E.2d at 154. Accordingly, the Court held that § 17-25-45 and § 17-25-50 must be construed together in determining whether crimes committed close in time qualify for a recidivist sentence. It is this quoted language that must be analyzed in light of the facts of the instant case.

C. State's Argument

In the present case, Taylor's crimes were separate offenses which resulted in two separate convictions. Section 17-25-50 does not apply to this case because his acts in Georgetown and Williamsburg were not so closely connected in point of time that they are considered one offense. The Supreme Court decided Gordon on the reasoning that § 17-25-45, read in light of § 17-25-50, requires that a defendant be "previously sentenced and then commit another crime." Currently, there is no South Carolina case that deals directly with the issue of whether the conviction of a subsequent crime (offense #2)

before the conviction of the prior crime (offense #1) is considered a "prior conviction" solely under § 17-25-45.¹

The State contends that the specific language of the statute should govern, and that the statute requires only that the Georgetown conviction be entered before entry of the instant conviction, not that the Georgetown conviction be entered before commission of the instant offense. While a recidivist statute is intended to deter commission of a crime, it is also used to punish the persistent offender and the State contends the defendant is the recidivist the statute was intended to punish.

Although the facts in Walters v. State, 371 S.C. 591, 641 S.E.2d 434 (2007) are significantly different, the case interprets the term "prior conviction" under § 44-53-470, a drug statute. The offense used to enhance the defendant's status to second offender occurred on July 28, 2000, two days after the offense at issue in the opinion. The Court held that the timing of the crimes was irrelevant to the determination of a subsequent offense so long as there is a prior conviction.

D. Defendant's Argument

The defendant argues the foregoing case law renders § 17-25-45 ambiguous and that when a statute is ambiguous, the rules regarding construction of criminal statutes require the court to resolve that ambiguity in the defendant's favor. The cardinal rule of statutory construction is that the court must ascertain and effectuate the intent of the legislature. Statutes, as a whole, must receive "practical, reasonable, and fair interpretation consonant with the purpose, design and policy of law makers." State v.

¹ Cynthia L. Sletto, *Chronological or Procedural Sequence of Former Convictions as Affecting Enhancement of Penalty under Habitual Offender Statutes*, 7 A.L.R.5th 263 (1992) discusses similar cases from other states. The states that upheld a defendant's sentence looked to the specific language of the statute and specifically the use of the term "prior conviction." Other states concluded that prior convictions must have preceded commission of the offense and resolve ambiguities in favor of the defendant.

Woody, 345 S.C. 34, 37-38, 545 S.E.2d 521, 522-523 (Ct. App. 2001). Therefore, in interpreting a statute, the words must be given their plain and ordinary meaning without resorting to a subtle or forced construction that limits or expands the statute's operation.

Id.

"Courts will reject the plain and ordinary meaning of statutory language when to accept it would lead to a result so absurd that it could not have been intended by the Legislature, or would defeat plain legislative intention." Gordon, 356 S.C. at 153, 588 S.E.2d at 110. If possible, courts "will construe a statute as to escape an absurd result and carry the legislative intention into effect . . . Moreover, [courts] are constrained to strictly construe penal statutes in the defendant's favor." *Id.* In my view, the defendant's ambiguity argument fails because the statute is not ambiguous on its face; judicial interpretation of the statute under a different factual scenario than presented in Gordon is more difficult.

The defendant claims that according to Gordon, § 17-25-45 does not come into play except when a defendant has been convicted and sentenced, and then commits another crime.² Such a broad reading of the holding in Gordon directly contradicts § 17-25-45.

E. Conclusion As To "Gordon" Argument

If the Court's intent in Gordon was to create LWOP eligibility only where the second offense occurs *after* the conviction for the first offense, then the holding arguably conflicts with the language of § 17-25-45. When the holding is interpreted in light of the specific facts set forth in Gordon, it does not necessarily conflict with the statute. In

² In my view, the Gordon Court uses this statement solely in support of its conclusion that § 17-25-45 and § 17-25-50 should be construed together.

Gordon, the Court was addressing the interplay between § 17-25-45 and § 17-25-50. The Supreme Court's purpose in construing the two statutes together is to prevent a defendant from receiving life when he commits two offenses that can be considered one offense.

Since the instant case does not deal with the interplay between § 17-25-45 and § 17-25-50, the holding in Gordon does not apply. If the defendant's Georgetown and Williamsburg crimes were so closely connected in point of time that they are considered one offense then the defendant would not be subject to LWOP. Although the crimes involved the same victim, they occurred nine months apart and are considered separate offenses for sentencing purposes. The purpose behind the holding in Gordon is to prevent a defendant from receiving life when two crimes should be considered one when it comes to counting strikes. The fact that the language of § 17-25-45 was changed in 1995 to include the words "prior conviction" instead of requiring the subsequent offense to be committed after the sentence for the previous offense compels this court to conclude that under the facts of this case (which again are inapposite to the facts in Gordon), the defendant is subject to mandatory LWOP.

5. REFUSAL TO GIVE "ADVANCE RULING" ON ADMISSIBILITY OF POTENTIAL IMPEACHMENT EVIDENCE

After the State rested its case-in-chief, the court conducted the standard inquiry of the defendant as to whether he desired to testify. In addition to advising the defendant of his right to remain silent, the court advised the defendant that if he did testify, he would be subject to the same rules governing the examination and cross-examination of other witnesses. He was specifically told that if he had been convicted of any crimes involving dishonesty or false statement, these could be used on cross-examination to impeach his credibility. He was further advised that if he had been convicted of any crimes

punishable by imprisonment for more than one year and that if the court determined that the probative value of admitting such evidence outweighed its prejudicial effect, these convictions could likewise be introduced to attack his credibility. The defendant specifically requested the court for an advance ruling as to whether his Georgetown County CSC conviction could be used to impeach his credibility as opposed to simply being used to establish a common scheme or plan under State v Lyle.

As noted above, during the State's case-in-chief, the court admitted evidence of the Georgetown County incident (but not the guilty plea) as evidence of a common scheme or plan under State v Lyle. At that time, the court instructed the jury that this evidence could be used only as evidence of a common scheme or plan, and for no other purpose. The court did not permit evidence at that stage that the Georgetown County incident had resulted in a guilty plea (and therefore an admission on the part of the defendant). During the court's colloquy with the defendant about his decision whether or not to testify, counsel for the defendant asked the court for a specific ruling as to whether the Georgetown County plea could be used against the defendant for impeachment purposes. Obviously, that offense carries potential imprisonment in excess of one year, but it is not a crime of dishonesty or false statement. Therefore, the court would have been compelled to balance the probative value against its prejudicial effect pursuant to Rule 609(a)(1). The court refused to give such a specific ruling in advance, as the dynamic of direct examination and cross-examination could impact the court's determination of whether the probative value of admitting the conviction for impeachment purposes outweighed its prejudicial effect to the defendant. In other words, "probative value" and "prejudicial effect" are better determined in the immediate

context of examination and cross-examination, rather than an academic analysis prior to questioning taking place.


The defendant points to no authority for the proposition that the court was required to give such an advance ruling, and the defendant's motion on this ground is denied.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the defendant's motions are denied.
