Enclosed is an order accepting the certified question in this case.


Since several of the attorneys before the United States District Court are not admitted in South Carolina, I call your attention Rule 244(d) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules which states:

Within fifteen (15) days of the date of the order of the Supreme Court agreeing to answer the certified question(s), any counsel representing a party before the certifying court who is not licensed to practice law in South Carolina and who desires to participate in the proceedings before the Supreme Court, shall make a motion to be admitted pro hac vice and file the application required by Rule 404, SCACR. In recognition of the unique nature of the proceedings under this rule, a counsel representing a party before the certifying court may be admitted pro hac vice without associating South Carolina counsel and without paying the application fee required by Rule 404. In all other respects, the motion and application must fully comply with the requirements of Rules 240 and 404, SCACR.
