PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel is attempting to complete the cases with the most number of extensions first.


4. Counsel has not had time to complete the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. As a result, counsel respectfully asks this Court for a thirty day extension in which to initial brief of appellant and designation of matter. Counsel is striving to limit the number of extensions requested. Counsel is attempting to complete the cases with the most number of extensions first.


5. As indicated by signature below, Donald Zelenka, of the South Carolina Attorney General's Office, does not oppose this request.

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case based upon the above circumstances.


