3 talk to your lawyer I'm gonna give you a chance to speak
4 with me freely. So listen carefully to what we talk about
5 and then, if you think there's something else I need to be
6 aware of, then I'll -- then you can let me know at that
7 time.

8 You are able to handle this hearing today?

9 Is that correct, Mr. Thomas?

10 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir.

11 THE COURT: Okay. Counselor, have you talked with Mr.
12 Thomas about this?

13 MS. WHITE: Yes, Your Honor. We had a prior hearing
14 last month that---

15 THE COURT: Okay.

16 MS. WHITE: ---was continued. So we had met prior.

17 THE COURT: I see.

18 There are some allegations that he's been violating his
19 probation.

20 Mr. Thomas, did you get served with a copy of these
21 papers?

22 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir.

23 THE COURT: Okay. Counselor, does he admit to some
24 violations?

25 MS. WHITE: I believe he does admit to some, meeting --

1 missing office visits, but he also denies some of the drug
2 use allegations.

3 THE COURT: I'll hear from you on all of them, and, of
4 course, if there's been some violation, then that would be a
5 violation and you'd be speaking in mitigation on that.

6 MS. WHITE: Thank you, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

8 MS. WHITE: Mr. Thomas -- we had a prior hearing and
9 one of the, the reasons I believe it was continued was, was
10 kind of twofold. One is he had a disability hearing
11 scheduled the very next week that he had been waiting I
12 think two years for. So he had that scheduled to determine
13 disability benefits and then also had a pending assault and
14 battery charge that he ended up receiving an offer on, and I
15 believe Agent Price asked me if -- they've offered Transfer
16 Court, but, as of yet, they have not scheduled him for
17 Transfer Court. So he is not gone down on that charge, Your
18 Honor. So that is still pending right now.

19 But he's had a lot of health issues and I know that,
20 that that is what, what is led to a lot of his issues, Your
21 Honor. He did miss some office visits, but, otherwise, he
22 was attending. He is obviously trying to get disability,
23 which is why he's not been able to pay on the money. He is
24 not been able to work and has not had any income that he can
25 pay.

1 Mr. Thomas had denied -- I know that there had been
2 some positive tests for drug reports. He has denied that,
3 that there were positive tests. I think he disagrees with
4 the, the findings of those.

5 THE COURT: Has he had any independent tests done
6 himself?

7 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir, I---

8 THE COURT: Do you have the results with you?

9 MR. THOMAS: No, sir.

10 THE COURT: Oh, okay.

11 MS. WHITE: So, Your Honor, we would just ask that you
12 consider he is having major health issues, and we would just
13 ask that you consider continuing him on so that he can
14 continue with receiving the disability and handle his other
15 charge.

16 THE COURT: All right, sir. This is your opportunity
17 to speak to me.

18 I'll be happy to hear from you.

19 Anything you want to tell him?

20 MR. THOMAS: I'm all right.

21 THE COURT: Okay. I'll hear from the agent.

22 AGENT PRICE: If it pleases the Court, Your Honor.

23 Mr. Thomas has been on my caseload from the beginning
24 of his probation which was back in July of last year.

25 THE COURT: All right.

1 AGENT PRICE: Prior to him being able to have his
2 intake, he was arrested on an assault and battery charge for
3 hitting someone with a tiki torch about the head and face.
4 I have the affidavit signed from the victim as well as the
5 incident report if you were so inclined to see that.

6 We subsequently issued---

7 THE COURT: Is that the A&B that's still pending?

8 MS. WHITE: That is, Your Honor. He's not been---

9 THE COURT: Okay.

10 MS. WHITE: ---convicted yet on that.

11 THE COURT: All right.

12 AGENT PRICE: We issued a warrant due to the violent
13 nature and took pictures of the, the victim and it, it
14 required a warrant.

15 After that, Mr. Thomas has not -- he has passed one
16 drug test in the last almost---

17 THE COURT: Out of how many?

18 AGENT PRICE: Out of seven.

19 THE COURT: So if he were saying that there were
20 problems with the testing, it would have had to have
21 occurred six times?

22 AGENT PRICE: Correct, and it would of most likely
23 occurred with the cocaine bracket because he has tested
24 positive for cocaine every single time but one time that
25 I've tested him.

1 THE COURT: I see.

2 AGENT PRICE: Initially I referred him I believe --
3 after the second drug test I referred him to NA and AA. He
4 didn't go. After the fourth time I ordered him to go to
5 free substance abuse counseling, which was less than
6 two miles from his home.

7 THE COURT: Uh-huh. (Affirmative).

8 AGENT PRICE: He never showed up. Couple that with the
9 failure to report, he reports whenever he feels like it or
10 if I issue or threaten to issue a warrant for his arrest and
11 come get him at his home. To the extent that I've actually
12 had to---

13 THE COURT: Well, you know, sometimes, if you have
14 problems passing drug tests, that means you don't want to
15 come in.

16 AGENT PRICE: Sure. Sure.

17 In all honesty, Your Honor, I actually had to go out to
18 his home to have him sign a notice of hearing because he
19 refused to come into the office. That hearing he did not
20 show up for when I called him that morning and advised him
21 hey, you're late. He said he was still sleeping.

22 The administrative hearing officer on that note then
23 referred or, I'm sorry, recommended that he be revoked in
24 full. And if I could just speak to a couple of other
25 things.

1 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

2 AGENT PRICE: As far as his monetary obligations go, he
3 has paid zero dollars toward any of his required fines and
4 fees. However, again, he has been able to afford marijuana
5 a minimum of four times, cocaine six times, and
6 Benzodiazepines that I've never seen a prescription for in
7 the 17 months that he's been on probation.

8 THE COURT: Do you have a prescription for that one?

9 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, I got a prescription for everything
10 she's talking about.

11 THE COURT: Marijuana?

12 MR. THOMAS: No, not the marijuana. I got a
13 prescription---

14 THE COURT: Cocaine?

15 MR. THOMAS: I got a prescription for the---

16 MS. WHITE: The Benzo.

17 MR. THOMAS: Yeah.

18 MS. WHITE: I believe he's---

19 THE COURT: Have you ever shown those to her?

20 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, I brung all my medicine in there.

21 THE COURT: Have you seen his prescriptions for those?

22 AGENT PRICE: I have seen prescriptions for Oxycodone,
23 which coincidentally he has never tested positive for, but I
24 have never seen a prescription from Benzodiazepine.

25 THE COURT: Okay.

1 MR. THOMAS: I got a prescription for it.

2 THE COURT: All right. Anything else, Ms. White?

3 MS. WHITE: Well, Your Honor, they do allege that he
4 did test positive for Oxycontin, Oxycodone too. So he does
5 have a prescription for that.

6 THE COURT: Well, I'm gonna ignore that allegation.

7 MS. WHITE: Okay. Thank you, Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: You're welcome.

9 MS. WHITE: I think that's it, Your Honor.

10 THE COURT: The recommendation from the hearing
11 officer, I don't have his report, it must of been handed up
12 the last time.

13 AGENT PRICE: I had both of them actually, both of the
14 pending ones.

15 THE COURT: If you don't mind passing that up please.

16 AGENT PRICE: I apologize for that, Your Honor.

17 THE COURT: That's okay.

18 All right. I'm gonna revoke the probation in full.

19 I'll recommend him to the ATU while he's in.

20 Good luck to you, sir.

By appearing without an attorney, you are acknowledging these dangers but are knowingly and voluntarily choosing to proceed without counsel.

At the violation hearing you will have the opportunity to speak, and you may present witnesses or documentary evidence on your behalf. If requested, you will also have the opportunity to confront and cross-examine any witnesses called to testify against you; however, the Department may elect to present affidavits of witnesses or police officers in lieu of testimony. State v. Pauling (Ct. App. 2006). It is your responsibility to have your witnesses and attorney present. If you are released on bond prior to your hearing date, you must report to the Probation Office immediately upon your release.

You are required to be at the hearing as scheduled above. If you do not appear, a bench-warrant or failure to appear warrant will be issued for your arrest. Furthermore, the Court may choose to proceed with the hearing in your absence. This directive remains in effect until you are granted leave by the Court.

This directive has been read to me and I have been provided with a copy. I was also given an opportunity to ask questions about this directive before it was signed.






