**MOTION FOR FOURTH EXTENSION TO FILE
INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER**

Respondent, State of South Carolina, hereby moves for a fourth extension of time to file the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter to be included in the Record on Appeal. In support of this motion, Respondent submits the following:

1. The Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter is due to be filed and served September, 28, 2016, pursuant to a third extension. 3. The undersigned consulted with counsel for the Appellant, and she has been authorized to advise the Court counsel for Appellant consents to the requested relief.






