This responds to your recent *pro se* correspondence.

To the extent you are seeking to dismiss the State's notice of appeal, to be admitted to bail or any other substantive relief from this Court, no action will be taken on these requests since you are represented by counsel in this case. *Miller v. State*, 388 S.C. 347, 697 S.E.2d 527 (2010); *Jones v. State*, 348 S.C. 13, 558 S.E.2d 517 (2002); *State v. Stuckey*, 333 S.C. 56, 508 S.E.2d 564 (1998); *Foster v. State*, 298 S.C. 306, 379 S.E.2d 907 (1989).

While you are permitted to file a *pro se* motion to relieve counsel under the above cases, it is not clear that the document entitled "Pleading Conflict With Attorney Violating Rule 407, SCACR" is seeking to have your current counsel relieved. Indeed at one point, you state that you are not wish to have him relieved as your counsel. If your intent is to make a motion to relieve counsel, then it will be

necessary for you to serve and file a motion that clearly states that is the relief you are seeking.
