

**SECOND MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO SERVE AND FILE INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT**

Respondent, MidFirst Bank, through undersigned counsel, moves under Rule 263 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules for an extension of time to file its Initial Brief of Respondent in this matter, and as grounds therefore states as follows:




