MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Marquise Green respectfully requests a **final extension of ten (10) days, until October 27, 2016**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court on October 17, 2016.
2. Counsel for Marquise Green respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.
3. On October 3, 2016, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Richey Lamont Boyd v. State with the Supreme Court. On September 30, 2016, counsel filed the


initial brief of appellant in the case of State v. Jeffrey Dana Andrews with this Court. Counsel presented at the Public Defender's Conference on Case Law Update and three error preservation exercises on September 26, 2016. On September 8, 2016, counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Joshua Griffith before this Court. On September 8, 2016, counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Shannon Scott before this Court. On September 7, 2016, counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Raheem D. King before the Supreme Court. On September 6, 2016, counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Vernell W. Harris v. State with the Supreme Court. **Counsel has extensive administrative duties as the Chief Appellate Defender, including administrative and Appellate Project oversight, and, training five less experienced appellate defenders and reading all of their writings.**

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a **final ten (10) day extension, until October 27, 2016**, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case that is **due on October 17, 2016** based upon the above exigent circumstances.




