
Dear Clerk Shearouse:

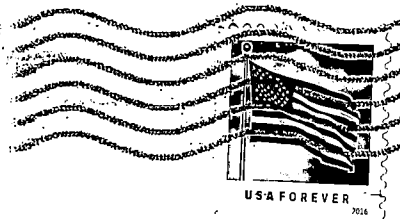
