MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Terry Williams respectfully requests an extension of **final thirty (30) days, until November 30, 2016**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.






5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.
