**Rebuttal To Motion To File Extension Request Out of Time**

**And**

**Motion For First Extension Of Time Within Which To Serve And File Response To  
Petition For Writ Of Certiorari**

Firstly, I am a Pro Se filer with a bachelor's level touching a master's level in Political Science if I do not jump the Master's with research in the United Kingdom with grace to access the Dphil, The Classics, and History. I am not a tenured lawyer with a Juris Doctorate in the law, a LLM in the law, or a Dphil in the law like Mr. Mark R. Farthing, Esq. or The Honorable Alan Wilson, Esq.
