MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Counsel for William Gregg respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for William Gregg respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



The State of South Carolina with this Court. On November 21, 2016, counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Keith Desue v. The State of South Carolina with this Court. On November 16, 2016 counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and the brief of appellant pursuant to White v. State in the case of Steven Spagnoli v. The State of South Carolina with this Court. On November 3, 2016, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Felix Kotowski with the Court of Appeals. On October 10, 2016, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in The State v. Jonathon Phillips with the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.






