This office will not review filings for redaction or to determine if materials should be sealed.

Since the orders on appeal do not indicate that a hearing was held before the circuit court ruled on the Rule 60(b) motion, it does not appear that any transcripts will need to be ordered from a court reporter. Therefore, you will need to serve and file a petition for a writ of certiorari and appendix within thirty (30) days of the date of this letter.

The petition and appendix must comply with the requirements of Rule 243, SCACR, and I have enclosed a copy of that rule. If you are unable to provide this Court with multiple copies of these documents as specified by Rule 243, SCACR, due to your incarceration, I will accept one copy of these documents. If the petition is to be handwritten, the handwriting must be clear and legible, and you must maintain at least a one inch margin on each side of the page.
