ORDER


By order dated April 5, 2016, the petition for a writ of certiorari to review the decision of the South Carolina Court of Appeals in this case was dismissed by this Court. In part, this dismissal was based on the fact the Court of Appeals had sent the remittitur in this case on June 4, 2015. This Court subsequently denied a petition for rehearing by order dated June 16, 2016.

Petitioner has now filed a motion seeking relief in this case. Among other things, he alleges that the signatures on the order denying rehearing are forgeries.

There is simply no basis for petitioner's assertion that any of these signatures are forgeries. The signature on the order of April 5, 2016, is that of then Chief Justice Pleicones, and the signatures on the order of June 16, 2016, are the signatures of the members of this Court at that time.

Since the remittitur has been sent by the Court of Appeals in this case, the motion is hereby stricken and dismissed. *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). Further, since appellate jurisdiction has ended in this

case, the Clerk of this Court is directed to accept no further filings in this case.
