## ORDER

---

First, Respondents' motion to require a corrected record on appeal is granted. The records on appeal that have been served with this court are hereby stricken. Within thirty days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve a record on appeal that complies with Rule 210 of the South Carolina Rules of Appellate Procedure and file a proof of service with this court. Specifically, the record shall include all matters designated by both parties for inclusion in the record on appeal, be consecutively paginated with page numbers on the bottom of each page of the record, include a proper index, and shall not include anything that was not designated for inclusion in the record on appeal (including argumentative statements or matters not presented to the lower court). Respondents' final brief shall be served and filed thirty days after service of the amended record on appeal.

Second, Respondents' motion to strike Appellant's final briefs is granted. Within thirty days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file final briefs that are identical to Appellant's initial briefs. *See* Rule 211(b), SCACR (providing "[t]he final brief(s) shall be identical to the [initial] brief(s) previously served under Rule 208, except for" the correction of typographical errors and the addition of references to the record).

Failure of Appellant to comply with this order may result in the dismissal of this appeal.
