RESPONDENT'S RETURN TO APPELLANT'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME¹

NOW COMES Respondent and makes its Return to Appellant's Motion for Extension of Time.

Appellant purports to seek "an additional "30-day extension of time, until February 24, 2017, in which to file Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter." (Motion, at 1.)

His motion is out-of-time and should be denied. Appellant was required to serve and file a copy of the Initial Brief "[w]ithin thirty (30) days after receiving the transcript or, if no

transcript is ordered, within thirty (30) days after serving the notice of appeal." Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR.

Appellant served Notice of Appeal October 24, 2016, along with a copy of an October 20, 2016 transcript request.² (EX. A.) Had no transcript been ordered, the deadline for filing would have been 30 days from October 24, 2016, Appellant did order a transcript (*but see* f.n. 2), which arguably extended his Initial Brief due date to 30 days from receipt of the transcript. (Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR). Appellant was in possession of the transcript in October or November because, by letter to the Court dated November 22, 2016, he requested a 30-day extension of the original 30 days to a "**new deadline December 23, 2016,**" (EX. B). This extension request was unopposed.

January 17, 2017, well after the filing due date based on the extension, Appellant served a Motion for Extension of Time, requesting "a 30-day extension...until January 24, 2017. (EX.C) On January 18, Respondent timely mailed for filing and service a Return arguing the Motion for Extension filed in January was time-barred, having been filed outside of the first extended deadline. (EX. D, without exhibits.³)

January 23, 2017, Respondent was served with the instant Motion requesting an second extension of his expired extension, now until February 23, 2017.

The Motion is time-barred and the appeal should be dismissed. "Upon the failure of the appellant to file and serve his brief within the time prescribed, the clerk of the appellate



court shall sign an order dismissing the appeal..." Rule 208(a)4) SCACR. The Initial Brief was not filed or served within 30 days of *any* of the following: the filed Notice, the receipt of transcript, or the 30-day extension requested November 22. Nor was it filed by January 23, 2017, the date requested late as being a 30-day extension from the first extension. The Rule states "appellant *shall* serve one copy of his brief..." within the 30 days required (emphasis added.) Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR. The deadline for the 30-day extension sought in November had long passed by the time the Motion for Extension of Time was served January 17, 2017, and similarly this subsequent Motion for Extension, served January 23.

The Appellate Court Rules "are not mere technicalities but provide the parties and this Court with an orderly mechanism through which to guide appeals in this State." Henning v. Kaye, 307 S.C. 436, 415 S.E.2d 794 (1992.) "The right to an appeal may be lost through a variety of actions by an appellant, such as: ...failure to serve and file an initial brief and designation of matter under Rule 208(a)(4) SCACR." State v. Serrette, 375 S.C. 650, 654 S.E.2d 554, (Ct.App. 2007)

For the reasons stated above, Respondent requests that this Court deny Appellant's latest Motion for Extension of Time as untimely filed.

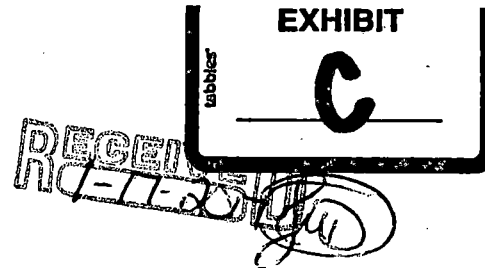



Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR.

Appellant served Notice of Appeal October 24, 2016, along with a copy of a transcript request dated October 20, 2016.¹ (EX. A.) Although the deadline for filing an Initial Brief where no transcript is ordered would have been 30 days from October 24, 2016, Appellant did order a transcript October 20th (see fn. 1.) This arguably extended his Initial Brief due date to 30 days from receipt of the transcript. (Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR). By letter to the Court dated November 22, 2016, Appellant requested a 30-day extension of time to file his Initial Brief and Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal. 2 (EX. B). Respondent was not notified of a Motion or related Order from the Court of Appeals, but did not oppose the request and proceeded under Appellant's requested "new deadline December 23, 2016." (see EX. B). On January 17, 2017, Respondent was served with the instant Motion for Extension of Time. (EX.C)

The Motion is time-barred and the appeal should be dismissed. "Upon the failure of the appellant to file and serve his brief within the time prescribed, the clerk of the appellate court shall sign an order dismissing the appeal..." Rule 208(a)4) SCACR. The Initial Brief was not filed or served within 30 days of *any* of the following: the filed Notice, the receipt of the transcript, or the 30-day extension requested November 22. The Rule states "appellant *shall* serve one copy of his brief..." within the 30 days required (emphasis added.) Rule 208(a)(1) SCACR. The deadline for the 30-day extension sought and unopposed in November (until December 23, 2016) has long passed and is 27 days overdue as of the
