Ms. Dunlap,

Your certified letter plus \$120.00 money order deposit was received by me on December 21, 2016 and has been placed in order of receipt for transcription. NOTE: Under our rules, I have 60 days to complete the transcript from date of receipt. In the event I need an extension of time to complete the transcript, I will request an extension from Court Administration and you will be notified if the extension is granted

Knowing the effort I have put in to receive your certified letter, I am quite affronted by your most recent email. Certified mail IS NOT placed in my PO box, only a notice that the PO is holding one for my in person signature before I can pick it up. I explained to you the difficulty certified mail presents when I encouraged you to send it regular mail.

December 9th was the date the Post Office received your mail. That was a Friday. My PO days, when I am in town, are Saturday, Tuesday and Thursday. Sat. the 10th I received the notice of certified in my PO box but the PO was closed and I could not pick it up. Monday thru Wednesday (12/12-12/14) I was assigned to Oconee County which is 1-1/2 hours from home. Though I did do PO runs as usual they were, by necessity of court assignments, outside PO business hours. Thursday and Friday (12/15-12/16) I was assigned to Pickens County, another 1-1/2 hours from home in a different direction. Thursday night, 12/15, I was notified by my daughter that my granddaughter was taken to the hospital and I left from Pickens to go to Charleston thus missing the Saturday hours at the PO. She has now been diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis. I returned to Anderson on the 19th late night. Taking vacation days, I went to the PO on 12/20 only to be told they could not locate the certified letter. I left the information off the notices for them to search. I received a phone call at 1:14 PM on 12/21 telling me they located it and I then once again went to the PO to pick up the letter. When I sat down last night to email you that I received it and read your email I decided it better to wait until today to reply so I could give you a detailed explanation.

Ms. Dunlap, in reply to your question on the deposit amount, please see the excerpt from my December 4 letter to you --

\* Reviewing my notes, this hearing will be somewhere around 35 pages. This may vary up or down depending on the amount of 'full' time in the hearing -- that is, the amount of off record conferences, etc. that took place and the general pace of the hearing. Original transcripts are billed at a per page rate of \$3.25 per page plus postage for mailing. Therefore, the deposit that is required for this transcript is \$120.00. This is an estimate only. Any shortage would need to be paid prior to the time of delivery of the transcript. Conversely, any amount received in excess of the actual cost would be refunded at the time of delivery of the transcript.\*
