III.





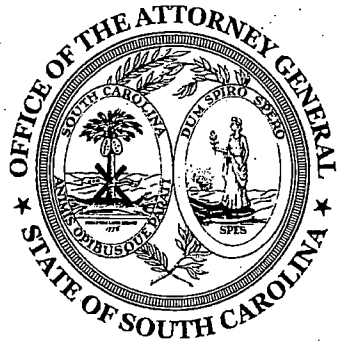
