
Petitioner's Motion to Dispense with the Appendix

By her undersigned counsel, appearing for this motion and contemporaneously-filed others, Petitioner prays this Court to dispense with the filing of the appendix because the sole reason for which the Court of Appeals dismissed her appeal, and the only applicable reason for which this Court dismissed her petition for a writ of *certiorari*, is the absence of counsel with a ban on self-representation in effect. That reason is fully apparent from this Court's and the Court of Appeals' orders readily available to this Court of C-track. 
