PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Julio Angelo Hunsberger petitions the Court for a thirty day extension in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. In support of this petition, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. This is the fourth extension for Mr. Hunsberger.
2. Counsel for Mr. Hunsberger respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Counsel understands that in the previous extension request, she indicated that would be a final, however, given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.
3. On November 15, 2012, counsel had an oral argument in the South Carolina Supreme Court in State v. Mark Baker. On November 9, 2012, counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Timothy Young. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Alirio Ortiz in the Supreme Court on November 5, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in

State v. Antrell Felder and the brief of respondent in Cazario Marshall v. State on October 22, 2012. Counsel filed the petitions for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendices in William Cornish v. State and Wiley Post James v. State on October 8, 2012. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Archie Hoover v. State on October 4, 2012. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Terrance Gist v. State on October 1, 2012.



Counsel is striving to limit the number of extensions requested. Counsel is attempting to complete the cases with the most number of extensions first.

5. As indicated by signature below, Salley Elliott, of the South Carolina Attorney General's Office, does not oppose this request.


6. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purposes of delay.

Counsel respectfully requests a final thirty day extension in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case based upon the above circumstances.


