MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


appendix in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. Counsel requests that time limits for filing the petition be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.


