This is just to recap our discussions this afternoon. As we discussed, the State's return to Mr. Miller's petition for appeal bond is due today. However, in drafting the return, it came to my attention that several of the attachments referenced in the Petition were not attached thereto. Per our discussion, you are filing via U.S. Mail (presumably today) a motion to amend and supplement the petition for bond to include those attachments. Because the State cannot file a complete return without at least reviewing these documents, I believe you are also requesting that the Court hold our return due date in abeyance until the Court rules on your motion.
