1 THE CLERK: This is indictment 2014-GS-23-2746,
2 Raymond Robertson indicted for unlawful conduct towards a
3 child, pleading to the same and it is a true bill.
4 2014-GS-23-2745, indicted for domestic violence of a high and
5 aggravated nature, pleading to the same and it is a true
6 bill.

7 (The defendant is sworn.)

8 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Crangle, you represent Mr.
9 Robertson?

10 MR. CRANGLE: I do, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: Have you had a full opportunity to go over
12 everything with your client?

13 MR. CRANGLE: Yes, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: And what does he indicate to you he wishes
15 to do in regards to these charges?

16 MR. CRANGLE: He wishes to enter a plea under the
17 State of North Carolina versus Alford.

18 THE COURT: Based upon your investigation into these
19 matters and your conversation with your client, do you
20 agree with that decision?

21 MR. CRANGLE: I do, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Mr. Robertson, how
23 old are you? Is it Robertson or Roberson?

24 THE DEFENDANT: Roberson.

25 THE COURT: All right. You're 46?

1 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

2 THE COURT: Do you understand what you're doing in
3 court today?

4 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

5 THE COURT: Do you understand these charges against
6 you?

7 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: Madam Solicitor, this CDVHAN, is that
9 under the new statute or under the old statute?

10 MS. TIFFIN: No, sir, the old statute.

11 THE COURT: So that's one to ten?

12 MS. TIFFIN: Yes, sir.

13 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Roberson, these charges
14 you're facing, the first being criminal domestic violence
15 high and aggravated, that carries a minimum of one up to
16 ten years in prison, do you understand that?

17 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

18 THE COURT: Now, your lawyer has indicated you wish to
19 enter what is called an Alford plea to that charge; is that
20 correct?

21 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: All right. And the other charge of
23 unlawful conduct towards a child, that carries up to ten as
24 well, do you understand that?

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

1 THE COURT: And your lawyer has indicated you wish to
2 plead under Alford as well to that; is that correct?

3 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: Do you understand what an Alford plea is?

5 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

6 THE COURT: Tell me what you think it is.

7 THE DEFENDANT: I am accepting the sentence offered by
8 the State but I'm not admitting to guilt, but I believe I
9 would be found guilty due to the amount of evidence against
10 me in the case.

11 THE COURT: Okay. That's a good way to put it. If
12 this case went to trial -- you deny your guilt but you
13 understand that if this case went to trial there's a
14 substantial likelihood of the State prevailing if they're
15 able to prove what they say they can prove, and because of
16 that you want to cut a deal and plead guilty under Alford;
17 is that correct?

18 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

19 THE COURT: Okay. Now, has anybody forced, pressured,
20 coerced or made you do that against your will?

21 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: Has anybody promised you anything or held
23 out any hope or reward to get you to plead as well?

24 THE DEFENDANT: It's my understanding that I am
25 pleading guilty to the five years.

1 THE COURT: All right. Now, has anybody promised you
2 that?

3 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.

4 THE COURT: Are you satisfied with your lawyer?

5 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, I am.

6 THE COURT: Has he answered all of your questions?

7 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: Do you understand you give up all of your
9 trial rights when you plead under Alford?

10 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: Is that what you wish to do?

12 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: Are you under the influence of anything
14 that would make you not understand what is going on?

15 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir, Your Honor.

16 THE COURT: All right. Listen carefully to what the
17 State says it could prove if this case went to trial and I
18 will come back to you. Madam Solicitor?

19 MS. TIFFIN: May it please the Court, Your Honor? In
20 regard to Mr. Roberson, on or about February 18th of 2014
21 the defendant got into an argument with his live-in
22 girlfriend's 20 year old son and they ended up exchanging
23 blows, and when the victim tried to step in to assist her
24 son she ended up getting thrown into the laundry room and
25 injured. So because of the problem -- and there had been a

1 previous situation where the defendant had pled guilty to a
2 domestic violence and he had come back to the home, so the
3 victim, you know, was in fear of the defendant. So after
4 that occurred the defendant did agree to leave the
5 residence and so the victim took him to a local Citgo
6 station hoping that he would stay there and apparently he
7 had been drinking, she wanted him to sober up and not come
8 back to the residence. The seven year old daughter of the
9 victim and the defendant was in the home and the victim's
10 son, who I previously mentioned, and the victim. And later
11 on they heard a loud noise and saw that the defendant was
12 actually busting into the bedroom window in the back of the
13 trailer and he was yelling that he was going to kill
14 everyone in the house. The victim's son, the 20 year old,
15 went back there to try to stop this from happening, he was
16 trying to call the police, the victim also went back there.
17 The victim's son, Matthew, ended up being taken to the
18 ground with the defendant, punches -- the defendant was
19 punching him, he also punched the victim. They ended up in
20 the living room where the victim did grab a knife to
21 protect herself and she ended up trying to run out the
22 front door to go get help. The victim's son then being
23 afraid when the defendant went out the door after the
24 victim knowing that the victim had the knife in her hand
25 and being afraid that the defendant was going to use the

1 knife against his mother, ended up shooting the defendant
2 with a shotgun that he had. After that the victim was able
3 to get to the neighbor's house and was able to call the
4 police for help, and officers arrived and investigated and
5 made these charges. So those would be the facts that would
6 be presented at trial.

7 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Roberson, did you hear
8 what the solicitor laid out to me?

9 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

10 THE COURT: All right. Do you still wish to plead
11 under Alford?

12 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: All right. The Court accepts your plea.
14 It's my understanding he's on probation as well.

15 MS. TIFFIN: He is, Your Honor. And there has been a
16 warrant served on the defendant for violation of that
17 probation.

18 THE COURT: I will be glad to hear from probation.

19 PROBATION AGENT: May it please the Court? He was
20 sentenced on January 16, 2014, before Judge Miller for
21 criminal domestic violence high and aggravated, the
22 sentence was five years provided on 392 days, balance
23 suspended to two years of probation. And he has been
24 served with a warrant, Your Honor, that was served on March
25 17, 2014. He violated probation by this charge he is

1 pleading to today, failing to pay monies and failing to
2 follow advice and instructions.

3 THE COURT: Mr. Roberson, do you admit that you have
4 failed to comply with the terms and conditions of your
5 probation?

6 THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

7 PROBATION AGENT: I'm sorry, Your Honor. He does owe
8 restitution and the victim did not want notification so we
9 will go forward today..

10 THE COURT: The victim is here, I think; is that
11 correct?

12 MS. TIFFIN: Yes, she is.

13 THE COURT: Same victim? Okay. All right. And I do
14 find that you have willfully failed to comply with the
15 terms and conditions of your probation. I'll be glad to
16 hear from the victim at this time, Madam Solicitor, if she
17 wished to speak.

18 MS. TIFFIN: She does not, Your Honor.

19 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Crangle?

20 MR. CRANGLE: Thank you, Your Honor. You've heard the
21 facts of this case, Your Honor. I have spoken to Mr.
22 Roberson, he understands the nature of the allegations,
23 Your Honor, and he has indicated that he is willing to
24 resolve this case, Your Honor. I would ask that you
25 consider a concurrent sentence of five years and

1 terminating the probation case, Your Honor.

2 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Roberson, anything you
3 wish to tell me?

4 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir, Your Honor.

5 THE COURT: All right. On indictment 14-GS-23-2745
6 sentence of the Court is five years. On indictment 14-2746
7 sentence of the Court is five years, run concurrent. I'm
8 also going to terminate your probation case, revoke five
9 years on that and end that probation. Good luck to you.
10 No victim contact, restraining order for the victim.

11 MS. TIFFIN: Your Honor, we also have this restraining
12 order to hand up.

13 PROBATION AGENT: May we do a civil judgment for the
14 balance of restitution?

15 THE COURT: Civil judgment for monies due.

16 MS. TIFFIN: And Your Honor, since these are new I
17 don't want to offend you but we've highlighted the area
18 that you need to --

19 (Break in proceedings.)

20 MR. CRANGLE: I just want to make sure the sentencing
21 start date --

22 THE COURT: He gets credit for whatever time he's
23 served.

24 MS. TIFFIN: He was incarcerated, I believe, February
25 18th of 2014 consistently.

1 MR. CRANGLE: We have 742 days.

2 THE COURT: Sentence -- I'm writing in 2/18/14.

3 PROBATION AGENT: You want me to start the probation
4 that date, too?

5 THE COURT: That will be fine. Probation is
6 concurrent as well.

7 MR. CRANGLE: He just wanted to clarify the no contact
8 order, he does have a child in common.



TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS:

Pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 16-3-1910, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the terms of this Order are enforceable throughout this State. Law enforcement officers shall arrest a respondent who acts in violation of this Order after service and notice of the Order have been provided. A respondent who is in violation of a permanent restraining order is guilty of a felony, if the underlying conviction that was the basis for the permanent restraining order was a felony and, upon conviction, must be imprisoned not more than five years. If the underlying conviction that was the basis for the permanent restraining order was a misdemeanor, a respondent who is in violation of an permanent restraining order is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, must be fined not more than two thousand dollars or imprisoned not more than three years, or both.

Defendant MOVES this Court to reconsider the permanent restraining order (PRO)

Facts

Defendant entered a guilty plea to CDVHAN and child neglect before the Honorable Judge Gibbons. At that time, Defendant was informed that a restraining order would be sought. Defense counsel informed Defendant that he would be restrained from seeing the victim of the CDVHAN. Defense counsel was unaware that Defendant's minor child, would be included as a party to the permanent restraining order.

After the entry of a guilty plea and sentencing, the State moved for the permanent restraining order. Defense counsel was not given a copy of the Order. Defendant raised concerns about seeing his minor child. The Court granted Defendant permission to modify the Order as to the minor child, by seeking a modification in Family Court.

Argument

Defendant MOVES this Court for a hearing to determine whether Defendant should be permanently restrained from seeing his minor child.

"To seek a permanent restraining order, a person must request the order in general sessions court or family court, as applicable, at the time the respondent is convicted for the criminal offense committed against the complainant." SC Code 16-3-1900.

Defendant recognizes the Court's power to enter a PRO. However, Defendant argues that a PRO, without any hearing on the merits, is an abuse of discretion and a violation of due process rights.

Defendant was not given a chance to address the merits of the PRO on the record: only after the entry of the guilty plea was the PRO presented to the Court.

Relief Sought


Defendant requests a hearing on the record to determine if a PRO is appropriate as to his minor child. In effect, a PRO is a termination of parental rights without any process.

Defendant was not given notice that a PRO as to the minor would be sought. Defendant was not given an opportunity to explain why a PRO would not be in the child's best interest.

Therefore, Defendant MOVES to Reconsider the imposition of a PRO.




Issue

Whether it violates Defendant’s procedural and substantive due process rights for a Circuit Court to enter a Permanent Restraining Order, restraining Defendant from communicating with his minor child, without notice to the Defendant or a hearing with fact finding on the record?

Facts

Defendant entered a guilty plea to CDVHAN (under the old CDV law) and Child Neglect. After the entry of a guilty plea and sentencing, the State moved for entry of a Permanent Restraining Order (PRO) pursuant to SC Code of Laws 16-3-1910. Defense counsel was not given a copy of the proposed PRO. Defense counsel was orally informed that the State would be seeking a PRO; the parties of the PRO were not discussed.

The Honorable Judge Gibbons signed the PRO, which prohibits Defendant from having any contact with three parties;

1. The victim of the CDV. (Ms. Lipscomb)
2. Defendant’s minor child. (D.R.)
3. A witness to the incident (M.P.)

Defendant was not given an opportunity to contest the PRO, by a hearing, with respect to the minor child.

Argument

A PRO is in-effect a termination of parental rights. Section 16-3-1910 permits a PRO to be entered into in Common Pleas or General Sessions Court.

Section 16-3-1910 does not require notice or a hearing with respect to entry of a PRO at a General Sessions plea. This is a violation of due process.

A PRO implicates Defendant's procedural and substantive due process rights with regard to his minor child.

"Procedural due process imposes constraints on governmental decisions which deprive individuals of liberty or property interests within the meaning of the Due Process Clause of the Fifth or Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution." *Kurschner v. City of Camden Planning Comm'n*, 376 S.C. 165, 171, 656 S.E.2d 346, 350 (2008). Fundamentally, due process requires notice, a meaningful opportunity to be heard, and judicial review. *Id.*

Conclusion

The imposition of a PRO between a Defendant and a minor child implicates Defendant's fundamental parental rights. To prevent Defendant from having any communication without notice or an opportunity to contest the PRO is a violation of his due process rights.

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENSE:





A full revocation of the remaining balance is warranted in this case and it would be an injustice to the victims and all those involved to continue subject on supervision. Revoking subject's sentence would allow the victims in this case to have some peace and assurance that there will no longer be a threat of physical violence while he is locked up behind bars.
