Dear Mr. Lyon,

From yours of 3/16/17 *"In exchange for your consent, and in the interest of time, I will agree to submit the supplemental pages, copied and bound, to the court on your behalf, picking up on the page number where your submission left off."*

The copy that you sent to me was unnumbered, and the copy filed with the court has only local pagination. You also included 26 blank pages that the court had agreed to be omitted. (2/1/17)

Concerning the district's Motion in Limine, a non-exhibit. As you know the withholding of 95.5% of my emails has been an issue as well as the two FOIA Requests that received no response, whatsoever. By extension, the district's Motion in Limine was used repeatedly to deny admitting my exhibits offered according to Rule 34 of FRCP pertaining to archiving and providing emails, as well as the limine motion being used to deny others of my moved exhibits.

Why would that Motion in Limine not also be an exhibit? Or was that one of the exhibits that Mr. Duff, Chairman Evans, or the District's General Counsel Drew Davis had removed during "jury" deliberations?


I will presume to cite the district's Motion in Limine at the hearing since it was such a tactical, if last minute, unexpected, and prominent part of my hearing----used to deny the board from hearing relevant

truth. The motion certainly should have been part of the Record on Appeal (Rule 210(e)).

Have you learned anything about my 17 exhibits that had been admitted, but then disappeared during deliberations? Those shouldn't be confused with the files containing the criminal records of two of the witnesses. I had planned to use the criminal exhibits to expose perjury (Rule 609 of the South Carolina Rules of Evidence). Those files were also shredded, but were not among the 17.

I have not yet had an answer to my Motion to Supplement the Final Brief. If the motion is granted the supplement will be gratefully short and bare-boned.
