Dear Counsel:

Apparently, the sole issue in this post-conviction relief (PCR) case is whether petitioner had been denied his right to a direct appeal, and the PCR judge determined that petitioner is entitled to a belated direct appeal under White v. State.

Since the belated appeal is from a guilty plea, I ask that you please “provide a written explanation showing that there is an issue which can be reviewed on appeal. This explanation should identify the issue(s) to be raised on appeal and the factual basis for the issue(s) including how the issue(s) was raised below and the ruling of the lower court on that issue(s). If an issue was not raised to and ruled on by the lower court, the explanation shall include argument and citation to legal authority showing how this issue can be reviewed on appeal.” Rule 203(d)(1)(B), SCACR (explanation required when an appeal is taken from a guilty plea, Alford plea, or plea of nolo contendere). This explanation should be provided within ten

(10) days of the date of this letter.¹

¹ In the event you determine that you do not have a good faith explanation to provide, I would recommend that you follow a procedure similar to that provided for in Dennison v. State, 371 S.C. 221, 639 S.E.2d 35 (2006), for the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR.
