MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Jayquan Dante Wilmore respectfully requests a **thirty (30) day extension, until May 29, 2017**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel four previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Jayquan Dante Wilmore respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. *Counsel is working on preserving the record for appeal exercises and a power point on Rules of Evidence Issues and Error Preservation for the three day Public Defender 103 training from May 1-3, 2017, in Greenville, South Carolina where he serves on the faculty.* Counsel is preparing to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case The State v. Arsenio D. Colclough with this Court today, April 28, 2017. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Allen Rauch v. The State with the Supreme Court on April 24, 2017. On April 17, 2017, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of The State v. Jalann Williams with the Supreme Court. On April 13, 2017, counsel had an oral argument in the case of Marion Bowman v. The State before the Supreme Court. On April 12, 2017, counsel had an oral argument in the case of The State v. Sandy Lynn Westmoreland before this Court. On April 7, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Tyrone Quick with this Court. On April 7, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Teresa Ann McCracken-Hall with this Court. On April 4, 2017, counsel, was co-counsel to, Laura M. Baer, when they filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Robert Graham with this court. On March 31, 2017, counsel filed the reply in support of petition for a writ of certiorari in the case of Bryan Rearick v. State with the U.S. Supreme Court. On March 30, 2017, counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of State v. Joshua Griffith with this Court. On March 22, 2017, counsel had an oral argument in the case of The State v. Harold Bennon Cartwright, III, before the Supreme Court. On March 20, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Stanley Miller with

this Court. On March 15, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the SVP case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of John Henry Dorsey with this Court. On March 10, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. John M. Ghent, Jr. with this Court. On March 9, 2017, counsel, along with co-counsel, Lara M. Caudy, filed the reply brief of petitioner in the case of The State v. Ryan P. Deleston with the Supreme Court. On February 28, 2017, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Tyrone Malcolm Benn with this Court. On February 24, 2017, counsel presented at the 26th Annual Criminal Law Seminar. **Counsel has extensive administrative duties as the Chief Appellate Defender, including administrative and Appellate Project oversight, and training two less experienced appellate defenders, and screening for interviews for an Appellate Defender position, and recently making a hire for an assistant's position.**

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.
