ORDER

In the explanation required by Rule 243(c) of South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed.

This is petitioner's fourth post-conviction relief case challenging his 2005 guilty pleas. Therefore, petitioner shall within twenty (20) days from the date of this order, file a response with this Court indicating why this Court should not prohibit petitioner from filing any post-conviction relief action, habeas corpus action or any other action, motion or petition in the circuit court challenging these convictions and sentences (including a motion under Rule 29 of the South Carolina Rules of Criminal Procedure) without first obtaining the permission of this Court to do so.
