





ARGUMENT



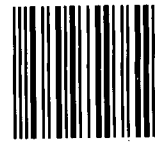

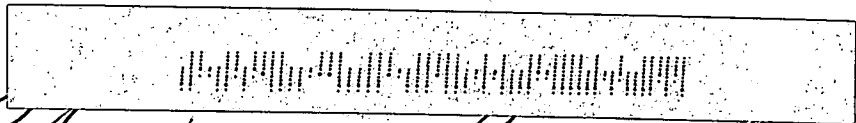
