
I previously wrote you in a letter dated April 26, 2017 **SC SUPREME COURT** requesting leave to correct errors in the order denying Applicant's motion to reconsider dated April 7, 2017 and the conditional order of dismissal dated Sept. 23, 2015.

According to South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedures Rule 52(b), amendments are allowed for timely filed motions and the lower court does have jurisdiction to amend the judgement. The evidence presented to support this request does have valid merits because these are substantial errors of material facts and failure to address these orders as written will deprive the Applicant of a mode of trial to which the Applicant is entitled to as a matter of right as these errors are appealable and reversible.

I RECEIVED A COPY OF THE ENCLOSED LETTER FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE REGARDING APPLICANT'S REQUEST TO AMEND BOTH THE ORDER DENYING HIS MOTION TO RECONSIDER DATED APRIL 7, 2017 AND THE CONDITIONAL ORDER OF DISMISSAL DATED SEPT. 23, 2015 STATING "YOUR HONOR NO LONGER HAS JURISDICTION OF THIS CASE AND THE APPLICANT'S REQUEST HAS NO MERIT."

APPLICANT SUBMITS THAT ACCORDING TO SOUTH CAROLINA RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE RULE 52(b), AMENDMENTS ARE ALLOWED FOR TIMELY MOTIONS TO BE FILED AND THIS COURT DOES HAVE JURISDICTION AND MAY AMEND THIS JUDGEMENT ACCORDINGLY. AND THE EVIDENCE PRESENTED TO SUPPORT THIS VALID REQUEST DOES HAVE MERITS BECAUSE THESE ARE SUBSTANTIAL ERRORS OF MATERIAL FACTS. FAILURE TO ADDRESS THESE ORDERS AS MR. HEW WILL DEPRIVE THE APPLICANT OF A MODE OF TRIAL TO WHICH THE APPLICANT IS ENTITLED TO AS A MATTER OF RIGHT AS THESE ERRORS ARE APPEALABLE AND REVERSIBLE.

Although the Applicant Filed his Notice of Appeal to Preserve it and his request for leave to correct these errors simultaneously, NOT AS A WAIVER OF THE Applicant rights to a mode of trial to which he is entitled too.

Applicant will ASK the Court for leave to correct these errors from the Supreme Court to protect his Due Process rights (see enclosed letter to the Clerk of the S.C. Supreme Court).
